PORFOLIO UPDATES

COURSE UPDATE - Brian Baynes

Dry weather means jobs for the grounds staff are changing away from mainly cutting grass. The teeing areas have been sliced to let air and water in. They have been fertilized and hoses with sprinklers are in use to try and keep them growing.

Fairways have also been sliced to help water penetration when the rains come.

More sand is coming for the bunkers.

The Course Advisory Committee met and includes the Course Convener, Mark, and representatives from the four player groups.

The new Glasgow Report was discussed and a longer term plan will be developed.

The initial projects will include improving the drainage on the path above number 4 green and grassing the current path below as well as changing the exit from number 5. This will mean a fairer result if your ball falls off the green and will spread locations where carts leave the path, which will be concrete.

There will also be some trees removed and trimmed followed by a stump grinder. When the digger comes to complete drainage on number 4 it will do a few other minor jobs as well.

Finally, thank you to those who have volunteered to help with the green weeding and paspalum weed wiping. We need a few more and if you can help with this please let Dave in office know.

Mark says thank you for those of you repairing pitch marks and he has noticed improvement so keep at it team.

USE OF ROUNDUP AROUND TREES

We are frequently asked about why we do not spray around trees?:

David Ormsby comments are as follows:

- Spraying is carried out around trees to reduce maintenance (time largely) and once you start spraying to reduce damage to mowers.
- Once you start spraying particularly on your light soils, the lack of vegetation causes the soil to erode, exposing the roots which are:
 - o Damaging to mowers
 - o Pose a safety issue for golfers due to lies around roots.
- In the main the turf cover under trees is usually very thin any way due to competition from trees (light, moisture, nutrients)
- The big issue I see with spraying as the scars around trees generally get larger each year and they spray out to the drip line (or beyond) of the trees resulting in large scars.
- My preference is to not spray and if you do spray it should be a very narrow strip around trees (300 400mm) wide to prevent weed eating requirements and so mowers can get in close to tree trunks.


We are pleased to report that the outside toilet and shower area upgrade is almost completed with just the painting to be finished soon.


The Ladies Locker Room design plan is also underway, and it is hoped we will have something to consider and cost out in the next four weeks or so.
